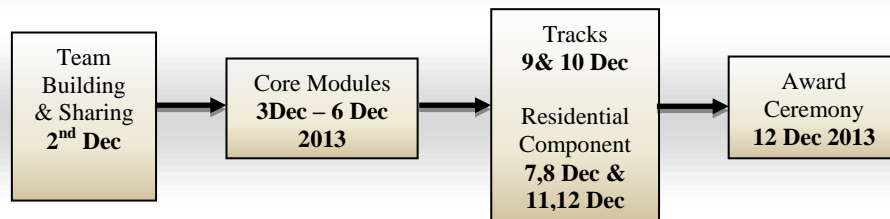

RESIDENTIAL COMPONENT

COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

MAHATMA GANDHI INSTITUTE

12TH DECEMBER 2013

The participants of the NICE project 2013 will be called to attend a 'commencement Ceremony' where they will be awarded a certificate of participation as part of a celebration under the theme of 'Nation building'.

Regularity, punctuality and attendance: Participants are requested to be on time at the training centres. The punctuality and attendance of the participants will be monitored daily. Only those who have attended the whole programme will be eligible for a certificate of attendance awarded by the Prime Minister's Office.

Registration of participants: The participants will be registered on the 2nd Dec 2013 and they will receive a registration kit which will contain useful material for the project. The particulars of the particulars will be verified on that day.

SMS register: The daily attendance of the participants will be monitored and any absence noted will be reported to the responsible parties through SMS via their mobile phones

Transport: The participants will be provided with bus transport which will allow them to travel freely from designated pick up points near their place of residence to pick up points.

Wear: Participants are requested to be dressed in trousers and sports shoes for the team building activities. The dress code of participant is required to be decent at all times.

Behaviour and language: The participants are invited to maintain a friendly composure where both the behaviour and language will set the tone for the climate during the NICE Project. It will be one which will promote both good citizenship and civil behaviour.

Food and drinks: Participants will not be allowed to alight from any transport facilities to buy food and drinks from shops along the way to venues identified for the project. Items such as alcoholic drinks and cigarettes will not be allowed.

Tracks: Students will be posted in private and public organisations/ companies where it is expected that they will comply with the ground rules of the institutions welcoming them. Participants will be aware of the etiquettes and will remain courteous.

Residential component: The residential component will be a time of greater sharing amongst the participants as they will learn to live with fellow youngsters. They will learn to take turns and understand each other as to be disciplined at all times.
